## "PRAYER"



Some pray everyday. Some pray at certain times. Some say prayers that they have been saying for years. Some simply just talk to God.

When we pray, we must remember a few things...

- (1) We shouldn't use prayer time to try and negotiate with God, "...God if you can let this happen then I promise I..." this is not productive prayer. Side Note: praying like this can cause us to get upset, because our prayer isn't answered the way we want.
- (2) Praying to God when we are in trouble. OF COURSE we should pray to God during difficult times, but this shouldn't be the ONLY time to pray to Him. \*Side Note: God is not a genie in a bottle to grant wishes or to wave a magic wand.
- (3) Rushing our prayers at the end of a day because we are tired. Praying before bed should always be done...we just need to make sure that we aren't half asleep when we do it!

So then what is productive prayer?

Well, it means we must offer God our best effort, discipline, and faithfulness. You can think of prayer in the following ways:

An instrument - the more you practice...the better you get. A muscle - the more you exercise it... the stronger it gets.

Make sure your prayer life is strong and is one of a beautiful melody to God!

### REFLECTION:

Is my prayer life powerful?

Do I build it up everyday?

Do I only pray to God when I am in need?

Do I ask God to help me develop a more productive way in talking with Him?

Do I offer my thanksgiving (since we are in the month of this holiday) to God in my prayers?

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I am a huge fan of Apple TV's "Ted Lasso" television show. I admit that I have watched this series from beginning to end many times. Every time, I find a nugget of wisdom that had escaped my attention the three or four times that I had watched before. Recently I saw a Ted Lasso meme that I have been thinking a lot about lately. I really am surprised just how deeply it resonates in me. I know that many of us have experienced times in our lives that have tested us. Occasions that pushed our limits, and try as we might, we may not have handled them with our usual grace and/or dignity. Listen, this happens to everybody, we are human. During those times, people judge us. It is not their fault that they judge us, they are human too. Humans react.

Here is what Coach Ted Lasso (played by Jason Sudeikis) said: "... I hope that all of us or none of us are judged by our weakest moments. Instead, we should be judged by the strength we exhibit when and if we are given a second chance."

Give that a minute to settle in, "...we should be judged by the strength we exhibit when and if we are given a second chance."

At first, I thought that this quote was about forgiveness. It may well be. But the more that I think about it, the more I think that it is about hope and faith. The hope is that we get a do-over. A second chance to redeem ourselves, not only in the eyes of those who judged us at our weakest moment, but more importantly, in our own eyes. The faith is in our own inner strength to not act or react the same way, and to trust in God's love.

We are taught that God loves us and that He is forgiving. These are lessons taught from the first minute of the first day of Sunday School. God never gives us anything that we can't handle. He gives us a do-over ALL the time!

It is what we do with our do-over that is important. Do we just concentrate on acting better than we did? Of course we do. BUT how many of us take the time to thank God, by going to His House, our beautiful St. George Cathedral, and thank him for His help?

Here is the opportunity for many of you to show your inner strength towards your second chance. If you have not made a stewardship pledge this year, now is your second chance, make a pledge. If you have not donated to St. George's for a while, here is your chance. If you have not been to church for a while, spend some time with us and celebrate the Divine Liturgy, listen to our choir, and enjoy Fr. Demetri's thoughtful sermons. If you have not brought your children

to Sunday school for a while, now is your chance. Our dedicated teachers await their arrival. If your teenager has not come to the Sunday Teen Discussion, our moderators look forward to meeting them.

## NATIVITY FAST BEGINS NOVEMBER 15



This means we have 40 days to prepare for Christmas!

We wanted to share with you in this newsletter the following explanations, one taken from the Archdiocese website and the other giving a further explanation for this time of year.

Let us make sure that we take full advantage of this Season in preparing our souls for the coming of our Lord in the flesh.

"The Nativity Fast is one of our main fast periods throughout the ecclesiastical year. Beginning on November 15 and concluding on December 24, the Nativity Fast gives individuals the opportunity to prepare for the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord and Savior in the Flesh on December 25. By abstaining from certain food and drink, particularly from meat, fish, dairy products, olive oil, and wine, as well as focusing more deeply on prayer and almsgiving, we can find that the primary aim of fasting is to make us conscious of our dependence upon God."

# St. George Cathedral Anagennesis News

### Shrimp with Feta Cheese

Garides me feta

- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 1/4 lbs medium shrimp

(peeled and deveined)

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 bunch green onions finely chopped
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 cup tomato puree
- 1/4 cup dry white wine
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 tablespoon brandy or ouzo
- 1/4 teaspoon oregano
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1/4 lb feta cheese cut in 1/2 inch

Pour the lemon juice over the shrimp and let stand while making the sauce. Heat the oil in a heavy skillet. Add the green and white onions and garlic, sauté until limp. Add the tomato puree and wine and let simmer 15 minutes. Sauté shrimp in the butter until pink (3 - 4 minutes). Gently warm the brandy. Ignite and pour it over the shrimp. When the flame extinguishes, add the oregano and parsley. Transfer the shrimp to a small casserole dish. Take the remaining juice from the pan in which the shrimp were cooked and mix with the tomato puree sauce. Pour this over the shrimp. Top with feta cheese and press the cheese into the sauce. Bake at 375° for 15 minutes or until hot and bubble. Makes four servings. Enjoy!
